1. ABOUT INSTITUTION:

St Philomena College was founded by Msgr Antony Patrao, who felt that a College in this part of the state would save the people the inconvenience of moving to distant places for higher education. He set out to realize his dream, and the mission was accomplished in the year 1958. Since its inception, the College has been growing steadily. Over the year, the College has earned a name for its disciplined functioning and achievements in the academic field as well as in the field of sports and games. Based on its infrastructure, learning resources, and achievements, the College has been re-accredited by NAAC with an "A" Grade. The vision is to be a premier Institution for Higher Education, constantly in service to society in the field of education and welfare. The institution's mission is to educate and train young knowledge seekers for their holistic development to contribute to the community effectively.

2. PREAMBLE:

In the current state of affairs, the institute ensures a pleasant coaching mastering method, research opportunities, and outreach offerings through a well-established feedback mechanism from numerous stakeholders. Stakeholders play an important role in assessing, improving, and enhancing the exceptionality of the learning experience. Stakeholder feedback allows the institute to assess how its service provision is perceived. We divide stakeholders into **internal** and **external** stakeholders viz Management, Faculty Members, and the students are the internal stakeholders, Parents, alumni, employers, and industry specialists, are the external stakeholders.

3. OBJECTIVES:

The feedback collection process aims toward continual improvement of academic and administrative facilities available in the College. It is achieved by the following parameters:

- 3.1To understand the loophole of the curriculum from the perspective of teachers and Learners.
- 3.2 To take the student's point of view for the improvement as the teacher.
- 3.3 To get an insight into the facility needed for the institution's growth.
- 3.4 To provide valuable suggestions for integrating required education reform while carrying out the instructional strategies.
- 3.5 To meet the job market's growing needs by establishing skills and knowledge via meaningful, outcome-based academic skills.

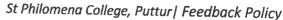

5. MECHANISM

The stakeholders give their Feedback in 5-point scale rating using the "AarGees Track Me" mobile app or Web browser once in an academic year. They provide the input, choosing one of the five questions' options by giving the thoughtful response as Excellent, Very Good, Good, Poor, Very Poor. On Five-point scale, the feedback score is calculated. The institution also collects Feedback from the employer. Employers will be requested to fill the feedback form provided by the institution. Parent feedback is collected at the time of the Parent Teachers meeting that will be held once in a year by giving the questionnaire.

6. FEEDBACK COLLECTION AND ANALYSIS PROCESS

The following actions will be part of the institution's primary feedback system:



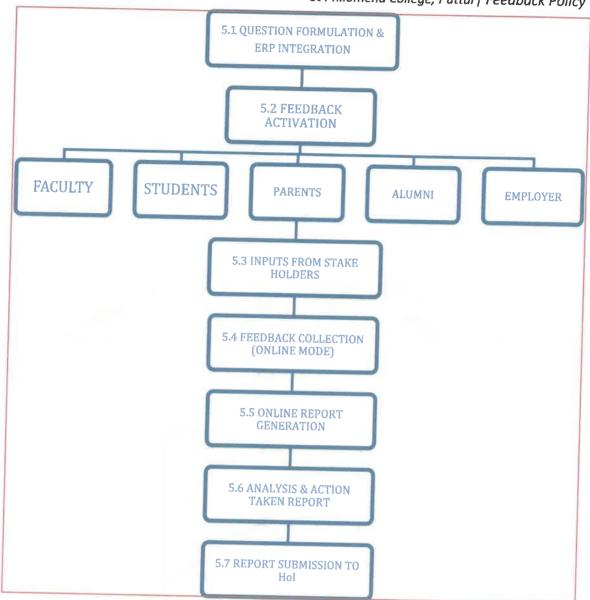


Fig:01 Process flow chart

6.1 QUESTION FORMULATION & ERP INTEGRATION:

The E-Governance Cell and IQAC, in consultation with the Head of the Institution, shall establish the formats for every type of input that each stakeholder is required to submit. Once it developed the institution's ERP admin integrates the set of questions.

6.2 FEEDBACK ACTIVATION

ERP Admin activates the feedback after receiving the proper authorization from the institution's head. Once it is active, the collection of feedbacks is made available to the stakeholders.

6.3 INPUTS FROM STAKE HOLDERS & FEEDBACK COLLECTION (ONLINE MODE)

The active feedbacks are accessible through stakeholder login, with the exception of the employer in the track me app for Android, which is intended for institutional use.

Stakeholders must connect into the app using the specified login information in order to view the same information.

Stakeholders can choose from a list of activated feedbacks under the "feedback" page and provide their feedback; however, once they do so, the input instantly disappears from the list.

6.4 ONLINE REPORT GENERATION:

Once stakeholders have provided input, the ERP administrator creates online reports based on the data gathered and submits them to the convenor of the E- Governance cell and the IQAC Coordinator for further action.

6.5 ANALYSIS & ACTION TAKEN REPORT:

The analysis & Action taken report of the Feedback is done by the E-Governance Cell and IQAC of the institution. These reports are shared with the Management, teachers for suitable actions and, if required to the University for better curriculum design.

6.6 REPORT SUBMISSION TO HoI:

The IQAC's analysis and action taken report was forwarded to the Principal for approval and execution in the appropriate region.

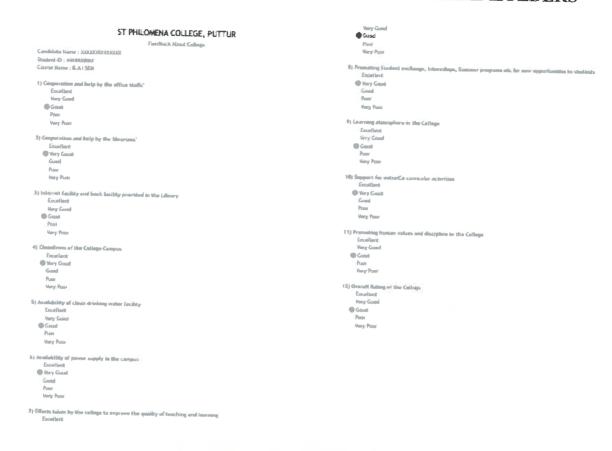

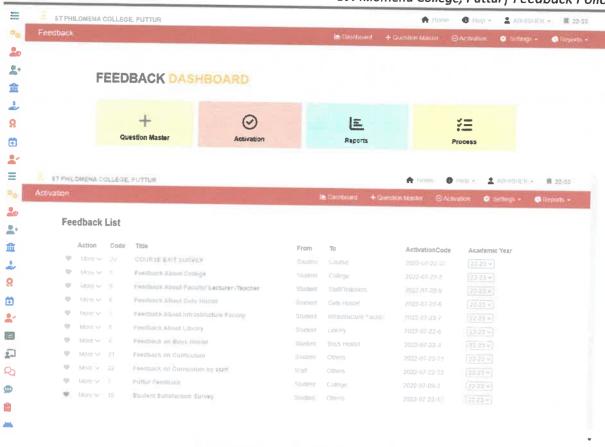


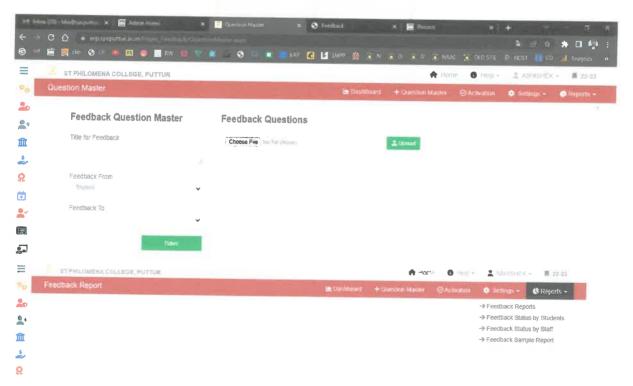
